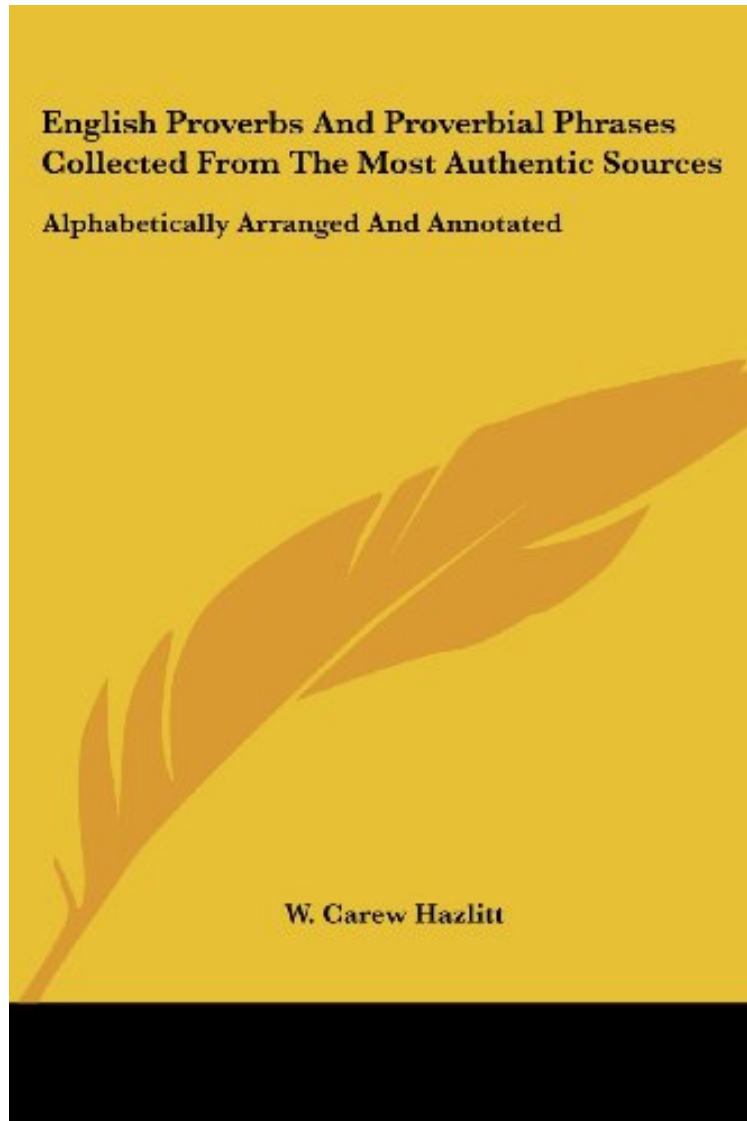

Provides hours of pleasure. This appears to be a reprint from a copy of the 1882 edition published by Reeves Turner, the venerable London house. That edition contains, as this does, Hazlitt's scholarly 30-page Preface which examines all the earlier works in the field from time-immemorial to Hazlitt's deadline; the list, at the back, of Hazlitt's 43 other books. It may also include the extensive catalogue of other books available from Reeves and Turner as of January, 1889, a joy in itself for any bibliophile. The text, 511 pages of proverbs from A to Z omitting only the letter X for which he found not a one. First up : A bad bush is better than an open field. Hazlitt's note attributes this one to Ray's Collection of Proverbs, ed. 1737. It is from the French *Il ny a pas si petot Buisson qui ne porte ombre*. Hazlitt adds, quoting Ray, That is, it is better to have any, though a bad friend or relation, than to be quite destitute, and exposed to the wide world. The last proverb in the collection, the second of two under the letter Z: Zeal with out knowledge is frenzy. (Trump take note.) End note. My review is based on my copy of the original which is headed for the repair shop. This reprint will make a wonderful placeholder while the original is in the hospital.
