engineering flowcharts. For the most part, it really works well. There's something more than a little odd about seeing evil twins or mafia nicknames arrayed on decision trees. That, of course, is where the humor comes in. In addition, the author introduces each of the flowcharts with short essays that are quite well done. As is the case with most humor, there's a fine line between "just right" and "more than enough." I liked the idea, and I liked the execution of most of the charts. There are, however, 29 of them; the concept begins to wear a little thin somewhere in those 29 charts. Don't get me wrong: I liked the book, and I'm glad I bought it. It's very entertaining, and I think it would make a great gift for several people I know. So, for me, it's a strong 4-star book, but I can't see it as a 5-star.
