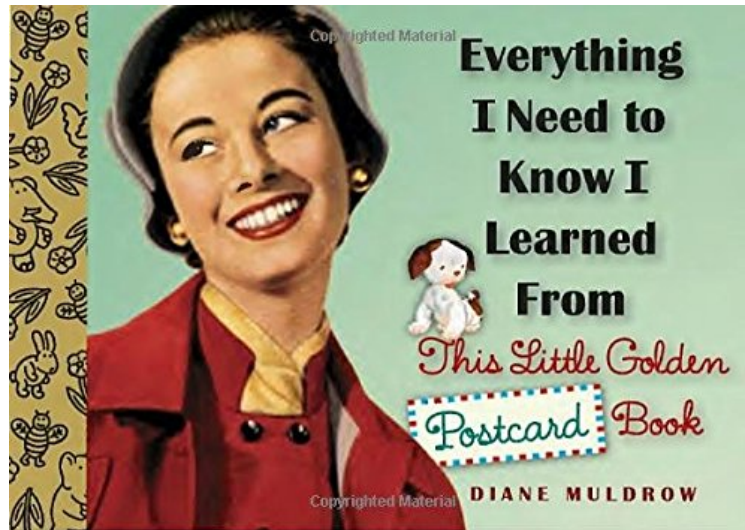

Flimsy Cardstock is Disappointing By Happy Reader From the illustration on the front of the postcards, I thought this was going to be sassy sayings with retro style illustrations. That's my own fault, because I didn't read the full title. Each postcard has an illustration from a children's book in the Golden Book series. The books were published between 1942 and 1963. What Diane Muldrow has done is add her own captions. They aren't quotes from the books; she added her own captions to the illustrations. So – this set is not what I expected, but it's still a nice set of illustrations, though more cute than I usually send. The name of the book, year, and illustrator is given on the message/address side of each postcard (and it doesn't take up too much precious room on the postcard). I knocked off a star for what I think is a misleading cover. But another star and a half is knocked off for the poor quality of the postcard and postcard book. I'm surprised at how flimsy the card stock is. These are less sturdy than your average postcard. At almost 4 1/4" x 5 3/8", only postcard postage is needed. The covers of the "book" holding the postcard is the same flimsy card stock as the postcards themselves. The cards are removed along a perforated line. It is almost impossible to take a card out of the book out of order. So I removed all the cards at once. Even that was difficult and I lost one card to tearing. In short, these are sweet little illustrations and captions. But the quality deficit leads me to rate this set 2.6 stars, rounded up to 3. removal is super easy. Personally, I just didn't like the repetition of bold black font. Yes, I know... Keeping with the theme of Golden books. I suppose with the bright pictures, I would have liked different colors of print to match. But again, personal preference is all. These are the perfect addition to a Postcrosser's collection as they can be sent to both children and grownups alike. Standard postcard size and added a few pics!
