Instead, I continued reading it and became disappointed. The timeline was hard to follow and the stories became repetitious. This is perfectly acceptable in a blog read an entry at a time, which is where this book originated, but when you turn it into a book you need to edit it for flow. Her life lessons and statements of faith were awesome. Her discussion of her descent into depression (only a small part of the book) was very helpful for those of us dealing with friends or family in a similar situation. I wondered why she didn't say more about her daughter with the delayed speech. For parents who are dealing with this serious issue her experiences would have been invaluable. It left me wondering if her daughter had apraxia, and if so, how the rest of us could recognize it before the child turned 4. Praise God for speech therapists who somehow make a connection happen and speech begin. Imagine the years of frustration for the child and the family that were averted. Overall, this was an interesting book that could have benefited greatly from deft editing. And, yes, I will be sharing it with my daughter because there are too many laughs to miss it.
