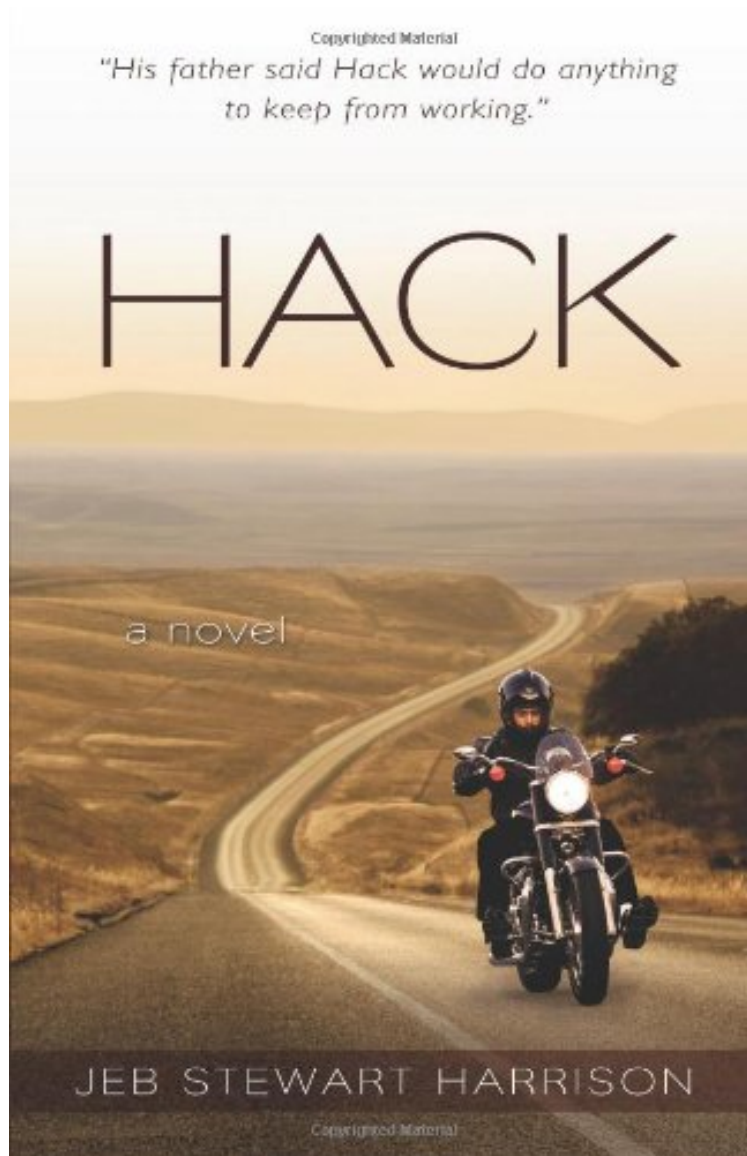

I love how the author uses the support of landscape to carry us through some, at times, madcap adventures as a man learns to release a constricted view of himself. There is a sweetness to this book, a tender touch, and it is funny. At times I was reminded of the movie "It's a Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World." Once you start this book, you won't be able to stop, and then, when it ends, your imagination will be so pumped you can keep going with characters you've learned to love.

When a film producer arrives at the California Heritage Gallery to view Hack's paintings, he's accompanied by the artist's childhood sweetheart, a woman he hasn't seen in twenty years except in dreams, where she appears almost nightly, a heavenly image of beauty and light. Now Hack is overwhelmed with desire and despair, for she's the trophy wife of a rich man. What could she possibly see in a downtrodden, besotted artist? So, in a state of love struck dementia, he hatches an outlandish scheme to win her back: fake his own death, thereby driving up the value of his portfolio, and then under cover, continue to produce "undiscovered" work, get rich, and one day return to claim his true love, when they'll ride "Fat Boys" together into the sunset to live happily ever after.
