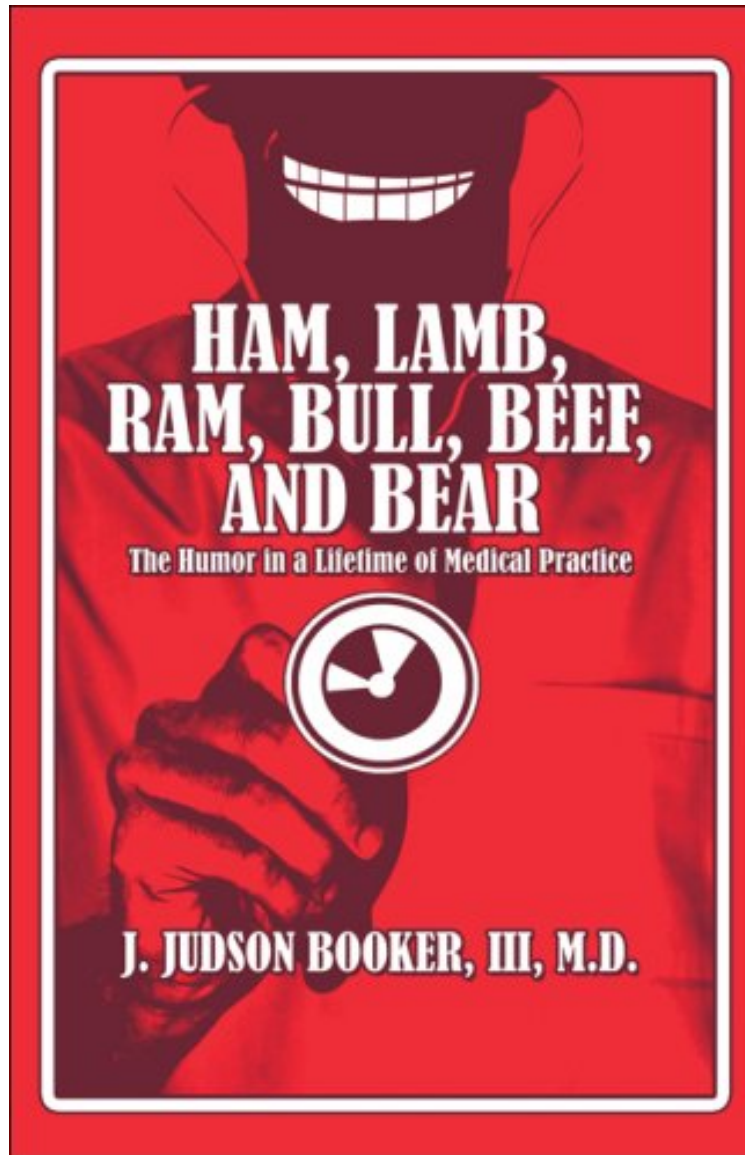

Smith dr. booker is the fifth generation of family practice physicians (his son is an OB-GYN) in his family. having been a physician for 40 years, he accumulated a selection of humorous interchanges and put them in a drawer. after 4 decades, he assembled this collection and published them. they don't violate any confidentiality. it's great fun reading through some of the goofs and funny things that we say and do. humor is, indeed, the best medicine, or, at least, medicine is best when combined with a hint of humor. dr. booker just passed away and after a decade of being his patient, i will sadly miss this treasure of a man. the book is fun. i'm not an expert on comedy, but, it cracked me up and got me thinking. i give this book an A- and it comes highly recommended.

From the time he entered medical school in 1963 until the present, Dr. Booker has been collecting humorous stories, anecdotes, quips, quotes, one-liners, and medical mispronunciations from patients, physicians, nurses, technicians, and others in the medical field. This burgeoning file eventually begged organization for publication, and, finally, in early 2008, with his partial retirement, Dr. Booker put it all together. This delightful book is the product of over forty-five years of medical practice from medical school, through post-graduate study, military service, and private practice. The humor is all the more engaging because it is set in a background of illness in which one would not expect such levity, but as noted by Romaine Gary, "Humor is man's affirmation of dignity, his declaration of superiority over all that may befall him."
