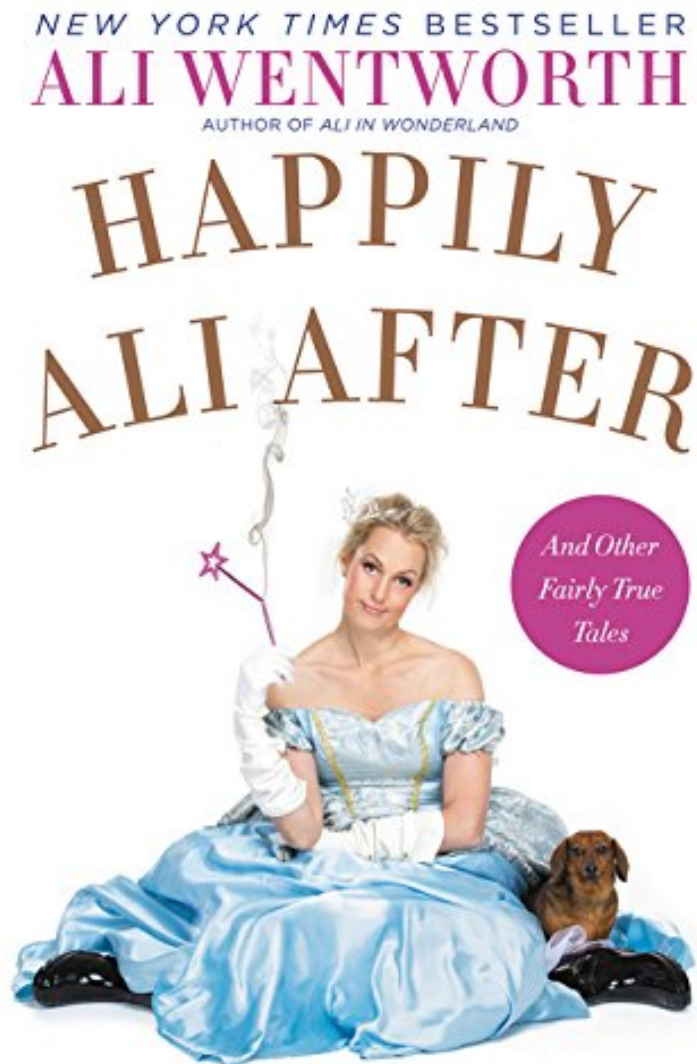

In this collection of essays, she writes about relationships, friendships, inspiration, marriage, parenting, and wellness.
