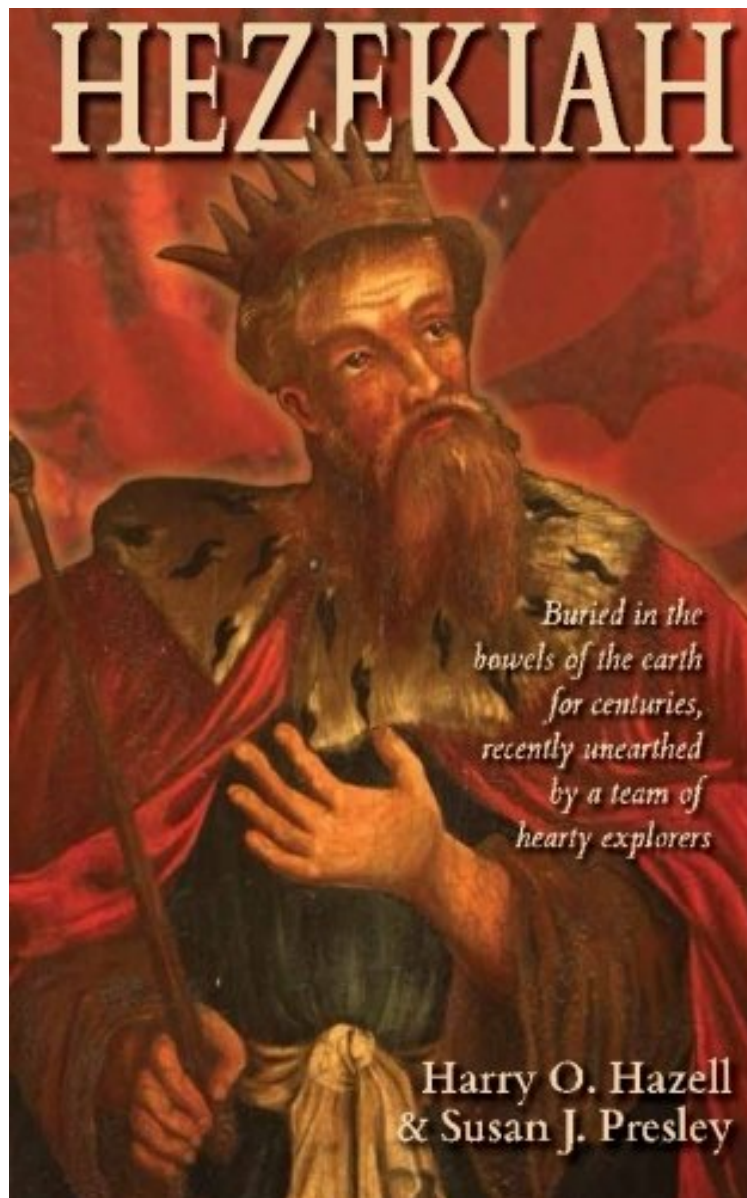

This humorous, possibly even satirical eight-chapter book (plus accompanying notes) is written in the style of the Old Testament prophetic books. Though Hezekiah was an actual king of Israel, there is no book in the Bible named for him. Therefore, the two authors have chronicled a fictional account of Hezekiah's life that includes idioms, proverbs, and aphorisms that are often erroneously attributed to the Bible. The notes that follow the faux scripture explain the true origin of the expressions in a light-hearted manner.
