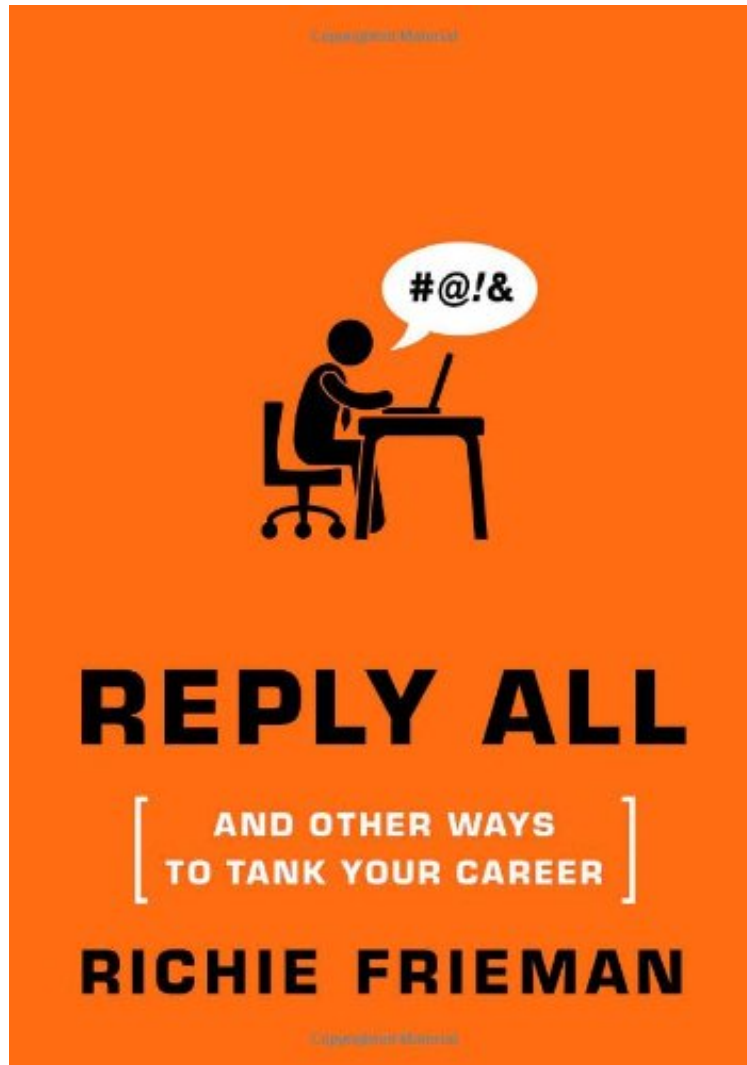

This book, on the other hand, left me wanting a bit more. It includes a lot of "If you've ever been out into society" kind of professional guidance; it isn't something I would recommend to a seasoned veteran in the working world who has managed to keep pace with modernity. I would, however, recommend it to either an (a) farm-fresh undergraduate who has never worked seriously beyond the typical high school gig, or (b) the work vet who is unfamiliar with the subtle but powerful changes social media has brought into the working world. While I don't regret the purchase, there are few nuggets of wisdom that I had never considered before and would say would blow the socks off the reader. Where I do give the author credit is brevity and comprehension. While most career guidance books may bore you, Reply All was actually quite hilarious at points and sobering at others.
