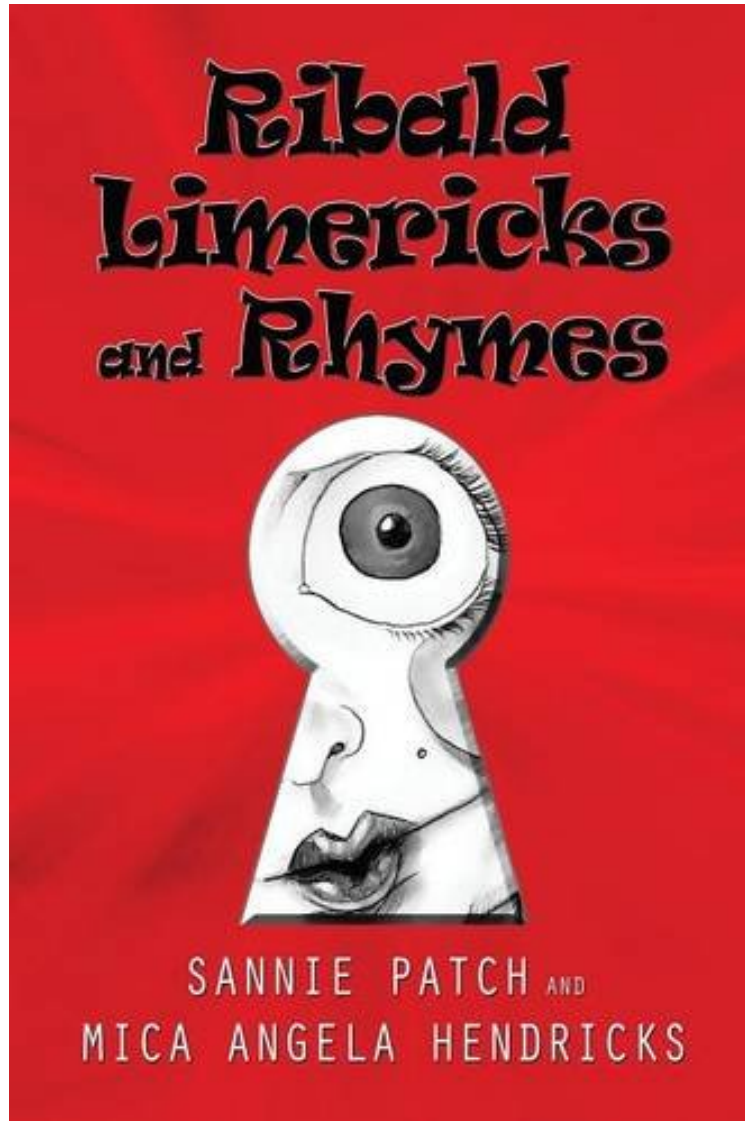

THIS BOOK CONTAINS sexual innuendoes, highly suggestive slang words and hilarious/absurd/bizarre human situations and activities. The original drawings highlight and compliment the ridiculous stories told in limericks and rhymes. The words and drawings are not offensive, but they are titillating and risqu. Many age old questions are answered in these pages-such as: What were Robin Hood and Maid Marian really doing in Sherwood Forest? And did Little John get in on the action? What was Little Miss Muffet really doing on that tuffet? (Hint: It was X-rated.) Was Yankee Doodle's "Doodle" really a "dandy"? (Oh, Yeah!)
