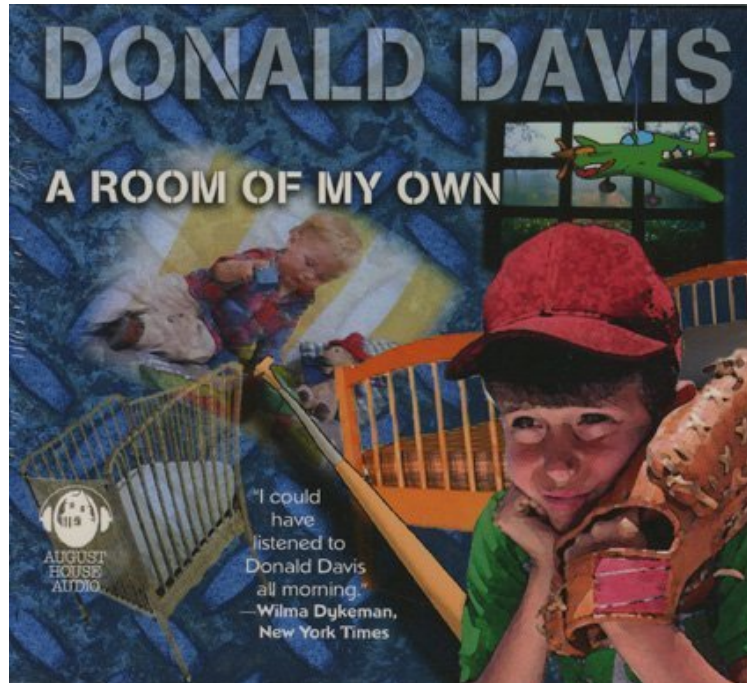

A lot about the birthing experience has changed during the past 50 years. A lot about child psychology has changed. For example, sibling rivalry: sometimes, a kid just isn't ready for some little squirt to come along and invade his space his own room. So what if there's an extra bed in the room? What if that were the stuffed animals are supposed to sleep? How could a couple of otherwise sensible parents just bring a new kid home without even consulting their very own son? Still, a younger sibling can be ....

Davis has a melodic, compelling voice, and, while seeming to meander through time and events, he weaves complex and complete narratives. As he talks about things like living in fear at Boy Scout camp, being at the mercy of the town bully, and the

joys of being uniform manager for the high school marching band, listeners will find themselves nodding their heads, smiling, and laughing. These stories are touching without straying into sentimentality as Davis tells of discovering the importance of family and good friends.
