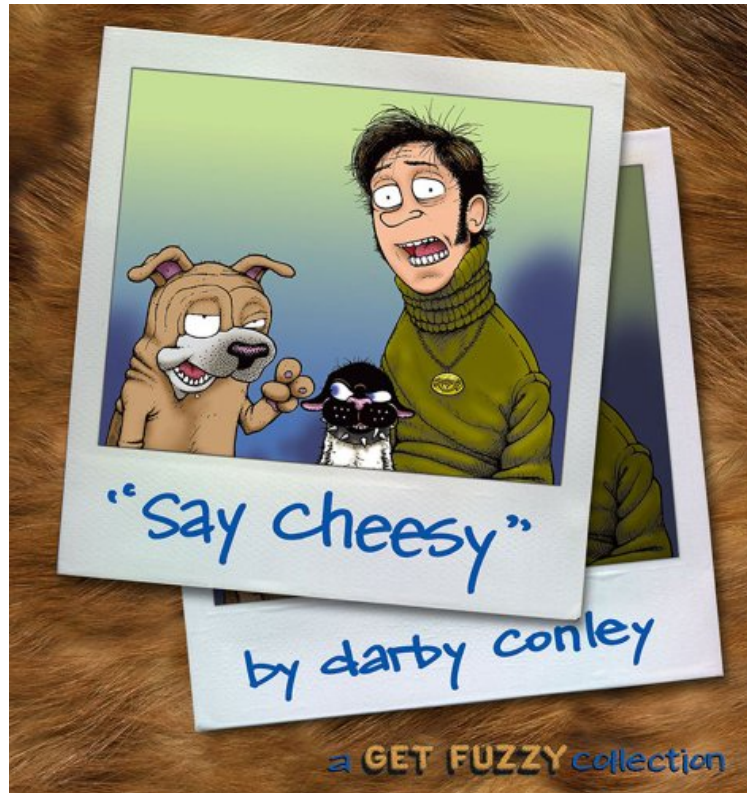

There are several themes to the strips in this book, of which the most prevalent and most amusing are Bucky's obsession with fighting Fungo the next-door ferret, and Bucky's other, even stranger, obsession with trying to eat a monkey (at one point he tries to get Rob to make him "Gibbon a L'Orange" for his birthday dinner.) This is a great book that is guaranteed to make you laugh, especially if you are an animal lover like me.
