It's like a best-of-Digg for educated folks.The only way to explain this intentionally Miscellaneous collection is by example. Within a few pages are: A list of the British Poets Laureate (1668-2004), the ten commandments (which was a useful resource when we got into an argument about the proper order), the wording of the U.S. presidential inauguration, a map of cricket fielding positions, eponymous foods (such as Beef Wellington, named to honor the Duke of Wellington), international envelope sizes, and diagrams showing how to wrap a sari. And there's 150 more pages of stuff like this. You probably don't NEED to know these things, but you'll be delighted that you do.
