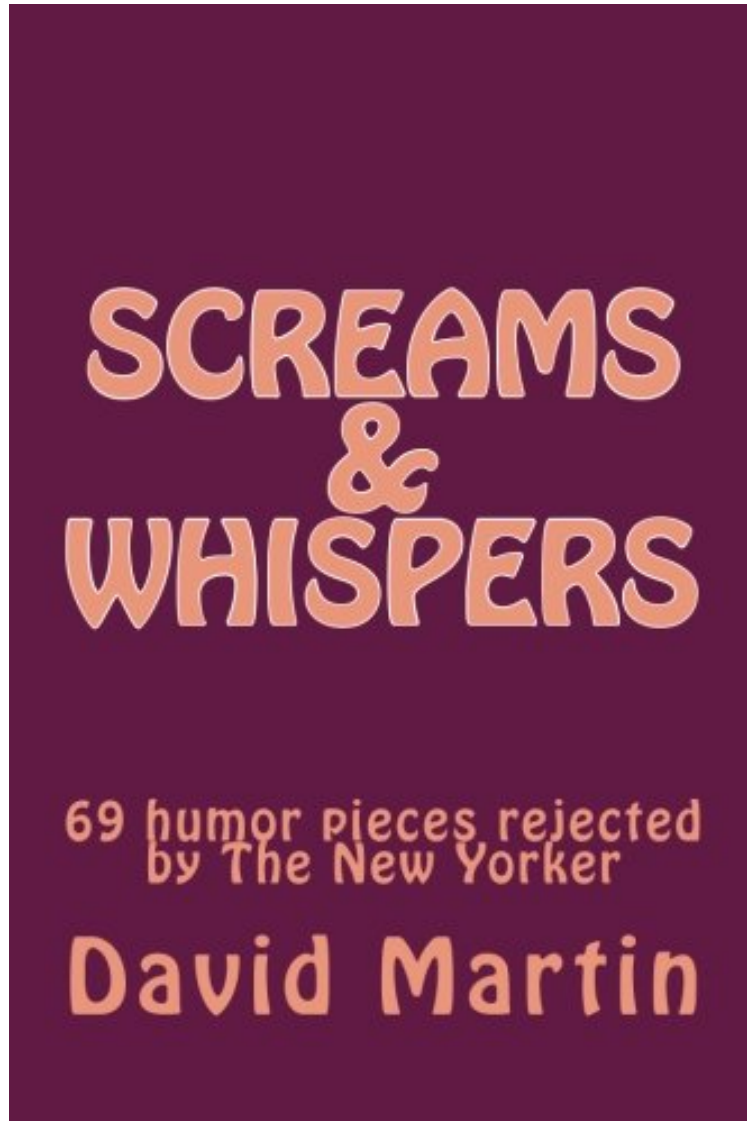

Luckily, they all found a home elsewhere and you can enjoy them in one compact little book. The humor ranges from the sublime to the ridiculous. From the early attempts of famous writers to create advertising copy to mid-21st century marriage announcements in "The New York Times" for robot-human nuptials, "Screams Whispers" is a fun-filled humor collection that should soon make its home on or near your favorite nightstand.
