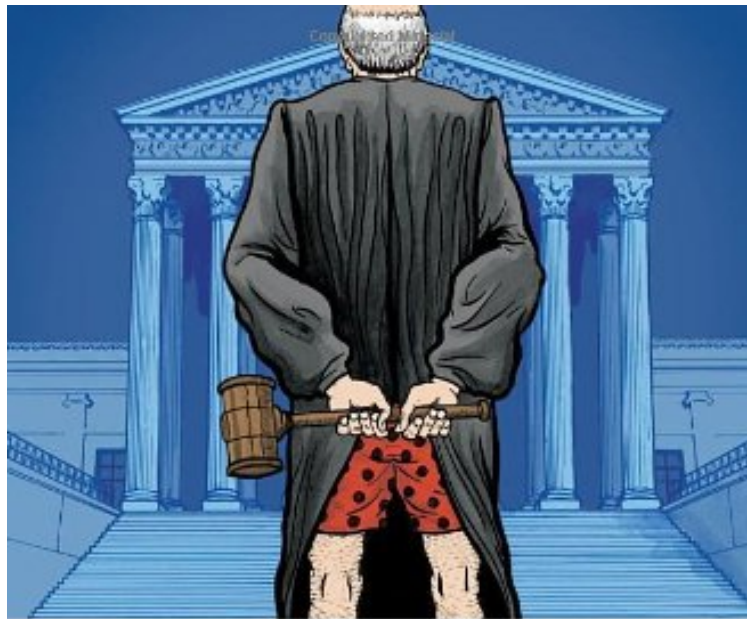

While I was excited to find and read another "Secret Lives" book, this one was not up to the standards of the previous ones on presidents, first ladies, and civil war personalities. Maybe the subject matter is a little less interesting, but this is a different author (and a different artist -- not nearly as good as the previous artist for Cormac O'Brien's books) and I think that has at least something to do with it. What's more, I had to return this book twice, the second time for a refund instead of a replacement -- the cover kept coming detached/unglued from the book. I am a careful reader, persnickety even about not cracking the spines on paperbacks, so this was not rough handling but poor manufacturing, which is obviously a knock on the publisher/printer, not the author, but still annoying and something that has never happened to be before (I own at least 1,000 paperbacks).
